## System wide approach, Education Health and Youth Justice.



Question	How will you ensure that local authority education and health provision
	is secured to support placements?
Answer	There's learning happening around the country and the ECRN is in contact with them to establish how the new announcement within health will impact how we work together. The DfE funded regional care cooperatives have integration as a high priority. More generally, there are 11 integration projects for health and care led by the NHS. Somerset has had a school developed by its CAMHS, and another one in the Northwest too, therefore we will be drawing on this knowledge to establish what works for the East.

Question	How do you intend to reform the residential sector to support juvenile offenders and make it more accessible for them?
Answer	Just by virtue of all LAs coming together, changes the narrative. Generally, for each LA this cohort represents low numbers but high impact, with matching being even more challenging. The low numbers, unpredictability and complexity make finding a financially viable service model, at a local level very challenging. However, coming together gives the region scale which enables different opportunities for specialist services and specialist training. As the ERCC works more closely with providers, the Local Authorities will get a better understanding of the challenges and what new solutions might be available. Alongside this, the ERCC is planning to work with Youth Justice to establish how we could work more collaboratively and create multi-disciplinary approaches to manage risk and rehabilitative approaches.
